





OUR COMMITMENT

Founded in 2000 by America's most influential ocean conservation leaders, the National Marine Sanctuary Foundation works with communities and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's (NOAA) Office of National Marine Sanctuaries to inspire the conservation of treasured places in our waters for a healthy ocean and Great Lakes, and preserve America's maritime and cultural history.

The Foundation supports the National Marine Sanctuary System, a network of 14 national marine sanctuaries and two national marine monuments that encompasses more than 600,000 square miles of marine and Great Lakes waters.

OUR CHALLENGE

The world's most pressing challenges are often difficult to see. Pollution, climate change, coral reef degradation, and species extinctions, are all problems that live beneath the waters' surface. They grow invisibly, but pose a global threat to our ocean and Great Lakes. America's national marine sanctuaries and marine national monuments are our essential network of protected waters that sustain coastal communities and our shared heritage, offer refuge for endangered, threatened and rare species, and serve as living laboratories for critical conservation research.

Marine sanctuaries and monuments belong to all of us. NOAA protects these special places, and holds them in trust for us to enjoy. The National Marine Sanctuary Foundation is a partner in their protection. We seek to connect people to their ocean, coasts, and Great Lakes, inspiring their stewardship and a lifelong devotion to their care and protection.

Inspire: We engage communities as enthusiastic stewards for our wondrous waters.


Connect: We link Americans with their protected waters, the sanctuaries to each other, funders to greater impact, and coastal communities to their own backyard.

HEIGHTEN VISIBILITY AND AWARENESS OF NATIONAL MARINE SANCTUARIES AND MONUMENTS.

- Build awareness of national marine sanctuaries and monuments by communicating their value to a healthy ocean and Great Lakes.
- Engage people from all backgrounds, perspectives, and regions of the country to work with us to protect marine sanctuaries and monuments and help us address the challenges that they face.
- Communicate the impact of sanctuary science, conservation and education programs to the well-being of our shared ocean.

CHAMPION U.S. PROTECTED WATERS, AND DEMONSTRATE THEIR VALUE TO A HEALTHY OCEAN AND GREAT LAKES AND STRONG COASTAL COMMUNITIES.

- Working with the Office of National Marine Sanctuaries, assess the priority needs of the National Marine Sanctuary System and individual sanctuaries, and identify national program priorities for the Foundation's philanthropic efforts.
- Strengthen public policy support for protected waters, with a focus on national marine sanctuaries and marine national monuments.
- Advocate for the expansion of the National Marine Sanctuary System and more protected waters.



CONNECT

ADVANCE STEWARDSHIP OF U.S. OCEAN, COASTS, AND GREAT LAKES THROUGH PARTNERSHIP AND PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT.

- Work with partners to support stewardship of ocean, coasts and Great Lakes and their resources.
- Increase public awareness of and improve stewardship of the ocean and Great Lakes and their watersheds by using marine sanctuaries and monuments as centers for education, outreach, and citizen science.
- Increase understanding of the value of protected waters as listening posts, living laboratories, and incubators for ocean solutions.

HOW DO WE WORK?



THE FOUNDATION is a nonpartisan credible voice for marine and Great Lakes protected areas at the national level with the ability to deliver on-the-water conservation results through local chapters and by engaging citizens, non-profits, and businesses in stewardship to support conservation work in sanctuaries.

THE FOUNDATION uses science, legal and policy expertise to inform our programs. We foster innovative projects that are solution-oriented, scalable, and transferable beyond an individual sanctuary's boundaries, and develop strategic partnerships that promote the conservation and recovery of species and their habitats.



THE FOUNDATION hosts Capitol Hill Ocean Week, often referred to as “CHOW” to bring together a wide range of voices on the most important policy issues, and to build a strong constituency for our ocean, coasts, and Great Lakes. Through partnerships and sponsorships, we are able to offer “open source” programming that brings together hundreds of people from diverse backgrounds to engage in the discussion and formulation of innovative ideas. CHOW hosts leaders and thinkers from a broad cross-section of industries and organizations, providing an important networking and education opportunity for the next generation of environmental stewards.
